


















Year 6 Trip to Bristol

In preparation for the event, the children will be improving their stamina in school, through small pockets of walking, jogging and running being added to their daily routine. Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances: -

- 1. Pupils identified by police and education welfare officers engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.
- 2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more). Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1st September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body have to judge whether there are exceptional circumstances and may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised. Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. The issue of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance. This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you take action without delay to secure their regular attendance. If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement, please contact the school or the Education Inclusion Office.

Penalty Notice relating to Exclusions

If a child is excluded from school, Section 103 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 places a duty on parents/carers to ensure that their child is not in a public place without justifiable cause during school hours. This duty applies to the first five days of each exclusion. Failure to do so will render the parent/carer liable to a Penalty Notice. (Alternative education provision will be made available from the sixth day of any exclusion.)

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice

The amount payable for a Penalty Notice issued in any of the above circumstances is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the Notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. If the Penalty Notice is not paid, the Local Authority must consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court for the offence for which the Notice was originally issued.

Please be aware that each parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for each child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents, and two children incur unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 28 days.

This week we have been learning...

This week	k we have been learning
Reception	We have had a very busy week in Reception. We started our week wearing odd socks and talking about what makes each of us special. We continued our learning about places all around the world with a focus on animals. We enjoyed sorting animals into their different habitats as well as writing about them. In Maths this week we have been learning about parts and wholes. In between all our learning, we have been doing lots of practise of our Nativity. Phonics: z,zz,qu, ch spelling words: zip, buzz, quit, chip
Year 1	We have had a very exciting week in Year 1. We started off by wearing odd socks to school to show that we are all unique and to celebrate our differences. We then wrote a class poem as part of World Kindness Day to highlight how we can be kind to others and how we can help others if they are feeling upset. During the week, we have had a lot of fun beginning to learn our Nativity songs as a year group and we have added actions to some of them. To end our week, we even wore our pyjamas to school for Children in Need, which was really exciting! Phonics: a_e - made, same, snake i_e - time, ripe, inside o_e - home, explode, stone u_e - cube, cute, tube Tricky words: could, would, should, our
Year 2	This week 2B shared their class assembly with the other children in Year 2, their siblings and grown-ups. The 2B team are so proud of them for speaking so clearly and singing beautifully. Year 2 have also kick started our Nativity practice. If your child has lines, please continue to practise these with them, ensuring they are slow and clear. Within our Literacy this week, we have created Kindness letters to our main character, Leaf. We have been focussing on our punctuation, specifically exclamation and

	question marks. Additionally, in Maths we have been creating pictograms to help us represent and interpret data. Bridge to Spelling: Short vowel sounds are protected by double letters e.g. spill
Year 3	This week, our Year 3 children walked to Ashford Library and had a great time exploring their wide range of children's books. This has helped inspire our further reading of 'Krindlekrax' where we have focused on the character of 'Corky'. He is a kind caretaker who shares his experience with the crocodile. The children wrote brilliant character descriptions of Corky and wrote a letter in his voice to the main protagonist, Ruskin. In Maths, we have continued to look at different ways in which we can add and subtract two three-digit numbers, particularly focusing on rounding to estimate our answers. To conclude our week, the children reflected on 'Children in Need' and created their anti-bullying poems. Spellings: To spell words with the prefix 'mis-' mistake, mislead, misbehave, misspell, misplace, misread, mistrust, misunderstanding, misuse, mislaid
Year 4	This week, Year 4 have been reflecting on how to be a good friend in our Anti-Bullying week. We wore odd socks on Monday and also wrote anti-bullying poems about how we can all be kinder to one another. We also enjoyed taking part in a Danceathon on Friday to raise money for Children in Need and wore our PJs. In Maths, we explored pictograms and bar charts including how to read, interpret them and construct them. In Literacy, we have written diary entries for Varjak Paw considering his thoughts and feelings in the events taken place so far. Spellings: Foolishly, Sadly, Proudly, Happily, Nervously and Completely.
Year 5	This week, Year 5 have been thinking about Anti-Bullying Week in Literacy. Each class was introduced to a picture book where the main character is having a difficult time, and the children have written letters to this character, 'reaching out' and giving them advice on what decisions to make. In Maths, we have looked at different multiplication strategies, including the partition method, short multiplication and long multiplication. We have also been using our scientific enquiry skills to consider different questions on the topic of Forces. Spellings: Words with the suffix -ant: distant, dominant, brilliant, vacant, elegant, ignorant, tolerant, abundant, fragrant, constant.
Year 6	This week, Year 6 immersed themselves in 'Anti-Bullying Week'. On Monday, the children showed off their odd socks and used their Literacy lesson to write an engaging poem to promote anti-bullying. The children also delved into their new Art topic; having the opportunity to compare the work of Lucy Arnold and Rosalind Monks in preparation for creating their own inspired pieces. In Maths, we concluded our Fractions unit and have moved on to Angles. To conclude the week, the children celebrated Children in Need and participated in a whole-school danceathon. Spellings: Words with the prefix 'dis-', 'un-', 'over-' and 'im-'. For example: dissatisfied, unnecessary, overreact, impatient
