Year 6 - Bedfont Lakes

Year 6 had a fantastic time at Bedfont Lakes this week. To support their Geography learning, they used OS maps to track their journey around the park, look at the soil compaction at a variety of locations and measure how they felt in different areas based on the human and physical geography of their surroundings. They collected data on how other visitors used the park which they have begun presenting, using different graphs and charts, during their Maths lessons. To support their Science learning, Year 6 also looked at the different habitats of living things they could find and will continue to compare these to the habitats found around The Echelford Primary School.







Boys' and Girls' Football - Cup Game

Last week, both our boys' and girls' football teams had their first-round cup games. The boys were away at Clarendon School and we hosted the girls' game here at Echelford against Our Lady of the Rosary School. This week we have been learning...

Reception	This week, Reception has continued looking into the world of the Jolly Postman, and enjoyed creating our collaborative character descriptions of the Big Bad Wolf. We've been looking at part-part-whole models to further explore our compositions to 10 and drew the week to a close with their fabulous performances of their Nativity Production! Phonics: Phase 2 recap
Year 1	This week, Year 1 has been exploring their ambitions and dreams through our storybook 'Astro Girl'. The children wrote about what job they would like to have when they are older and what steps to take in order to achieve the goal. In Maths, we have been learning about 1 more and less of a given number within 20. In our PE lesson, we performed our final dance routine to the Year 2 children. Well done! On Thursday, we also went for a local walk around Ashford to look for different types of homes and houses. Phonics: Phase 3 and 5 recap
Year 2	We have been busy with Nativity practise this week. In Literacy we have been using expanded noun phrases in our writing as we look at the Emperor's penguin. In Maths we have started learning about multiplication. Across our foundation subjects we have learnt more about giving in Christianity and are working hard to create our penguin hand puppets. Bridge to Spelling: Add -es to make a plural if the word ends in s,x,z,sh,ch
Year 3	This week in Krindlekrax, it is explained how the crocodile ended up in the sewers. Inspired by this, each class went on a walk to find a crocodile. Going to the pond, each class found their very own class pet and wrote instructions on how to care for the reptile. In Maths, we have started our fifth unit looking at measurements, specifically millimetres and centimetres. The children have done well to estimate objects found in the classroom and have begun to work out the perimeter of objects. Spellings: forgetting, forgotten, beginning, propelled, preferred, permitted, regretting, committed, forbidden, equipped
Year 4	This week, Year 4 have been focusing on their descriptive writing and in particular, using expanded noun phrases to describe an exciting scene from their core text, 'Varjak Paw'. In Maths, Year 4 have been rehearsing their 7 and 9 times tables and have been identifying

	multiplication patterns. In History this week, we have been discovering all the incredible things that the Ancient Mesopotamians invented, and how many are still in use today. Spellings: Words where 'ch' makes the 'sh' sound, for example, chalet, chandelier and quiche.
Year 5	As we approach the climax of 'Floodland' in our Literacy lessons, Year 5 have been writing a balanced argument based on a dilemma our protagonist faces, considering both sides of the argument equally. In Maths, we have been learning how to use the short division method to answer division questions, including division calculations with reminders. In Science, we have been exploring forces and carrying out investigations using Newton Metres, whilst in Art we have begun to practise our printing skills to create a repeated wave pattern. Spellings: Words with the suffix -ent or -ence: eloquence, frequent, emergent, innocence, transparent, intelligence, consequence, decent, violent, competence
Year 6	Year 6 have had an action-packed week this week! On Tuesday, we spent the day at Bedfont Lakes Country Park and took part in a range of activities which included: map reading; investigating the compaction of the soil; observing habitats; classifying wildlife; completing surveys and sketching the area. This trip was a fantastic way to consolidate both our Science and Geography learning this term. In Literacy, we have been focussing on integrating dialogue into our narrative pieces; developing this to ensure the speech portrays character, setting and mood. We finished the week with the 'Santa Fun Run' and it was fantastic to see all of the children take part! Spellings: Words with the 'f' sound spelt 'ph' For example: pheasant, alphabet, sphere, physical


Achievements outside of school
