This week we have been learning... Reception It has been a fun filled week in all Reception classes as we have been reading the story of Stick Man. The children loved writing thank you letters to Santa and got stuck in with our role play sessions. In maths, each class has been practising using the bead strings to help them represent their numbers. On Wednesday, the children had fun at our Christmas pause day. They loved decorating their classes and taking part in new craft activities. Phonics: Review week of all phase 2 sounds. Year 1 This week we have been getting excited about Christmas with our Christmas pause day. We decorated our door and made some cards for our reading buddies. We have been reading How The Grinch Stole Christmas and thinking of exciting adjectives to describe The Grinch. In maths we have been doubling and halving numbers up to 20 using practical resources. We have also designed our own breakfast pots in DT that we will be making next week and built our own Nativity scene out of scrap modelling in RE. Phonics: Reviewing our new phase 5 sounds Year 2 As we are coming to the end of the term, Year 2 have been drawing a close to all our different topics. In Geography we have concluded our learning about continents and oceans. We have been completing the sewing for our penguin puppets and have used our knowledge of ScratchJr to predict what algorithms would do. In Literacy this week we have created pages of a class book about penguins. In Maths we have been deepening our knowledge of multiplication and division - this will continue in the Spring term. **Bridge to Spelling:** Rule: Swap the y for an i when you add -ed (e.g. tried, carried) Exceptions: when the y is part of a digraph (e.g. annoyed) Rule: drop the e before adding -ing (e.g. hiding). Exceptions: when the e makes the /ee/ sound (e.g. being, seeing, freeing) Year 3 After a busy week of rehearsals, Year 3 produced two fantastic Christmas carol performances for their adults to enjoy on Thursday. We have also been writing stories based on a Christmas adventure, using all of the skills we have been learning over the past term. In art, we have been making cubism inspired Christmas cards and practising our new found shading skills. Spellings: To spell words with the digraph 'ai' and tetragraph 'aigh'. Year 4 This week, Year 4 have been perfecting our songs for our Christmas concerts that took place yesterday. We have also been learning about how Christians celebrate Christmas around the world and sharing our own family Christmas traditions. It has been wonderful to hear about how differently we all approach the festive season and to celebrate that, despite our differences, themes of family, love and spending time together shone through. In Maths, we have been continuing our learning about fractions. Try asking me what a vinculum is! Spellings: We have been practising spelling our Year 3 and 4 common exception words this week Year 5 This week, Year 5 have been busy performing in the Upper KS2 Christmas concerts! The children were able to use their developed Computing skills to embed hyperlinks, images and animations. Spellings: We have continued to revise our Year 5 & 6 Common Exception Words.
