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## Co-Headteacher's Message

Welcome to the updated Echelford Echo. We hope you enjoy our new format and find the information shared each week useful and easier to access.

We have carefully considered the information that is most useful to you as parents and carers each week which can be read, digested and then also referred back to throughout the week. We want the newsletter to keep you informed with information about what has been happening during the week in school as well as reminders about what is coming up in the future. Our newsletter also celebrates the individual successes of children both in school and out of school. All of this information will be included in the main body of the newsletter each week.

You will notice that there are a number of quick links on the left-hand side of this page. These will take you directly to separate pages of our website. They include links to term dates, online forms and information about pastoral support in school. Each week, you will be able to use the 'we have been learning' link to see what each class has been learning throughout the week. Our curriculum link shares information about the whole curriculum for each year group. This is the area to visit when you want to find out more detail about what your child will be learning about or has been learning at school. For each year group, you will see an overview of the curriculum for the whole year and then the curriculum web and knowledge organisers: we have just updated these documents for this half term. We hope that all of this information helps you to feel informed about the learning that is taking place in school and supports you with conversations about school, at home (beyond the limited responses that you might get when you ask your child what they have been learning)!

Our first curriculum visits and experiences of the term have taken place this week for some of our year groups. On Monday, our year 6 children took part in a Macbeth inspired day involving three morning workshops which they have built on this week to write a poem based on the witches potion.

On Tuesday, Year 1 were immersed in their new topic. The children dressed up as Superheroes and introduced the book 'Traction Man'.

Year 3 enjoyed a visit from Chertsey Museum on Wednesday to explore hundreds of Stone Age artefacts and replicas - a fantastic start to their topic this term.

After school today, our Girls football team will be playing their first match of 2024. They hope to continue their unbeaten record and we look forward to sharing with you information about their match as well as more learning highlights in our newsletter next week.


#### **Reception 2024 applications**


