

PE:

Athletics (track):

- To sprint, I move my arms and legs with more power. To start, I put my stronger leg behind me and continue at top speed until I have passed the finish line.
- When jogging, I inhale through my nose and exhale through my mouth. My upper body is more relaxed than when I sprint.

Athletics (field):

- To increase my power when throwing, I transfer my body weight from my back foot to my front foot.
- To generate momentum and power, I need a smooth transition between my hop, skip and jump.
- To complete an effective triple jump, I hop with my weakest leg. I skip onto my stronger leg to build momentum for my final jump.
- Momentum: consistent motion/moving.



RE:

- Siddhartha Gautama (better known as the Buddha) was a Hindu prince who renounced his position and wealth to seek enlightenment, attained his goal and founded Buddhism in India in the 6th-5th centuries BCE.
- Buddhists follow dhamma (teachings) to avoid bad karma & escape the cycle of samsara (the cycle of life, death and rebirth).

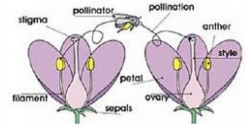


PSHE:
