

Stay on Green



In class and around school, we use colours to help children understand the choices they are making.

Staying on Green means children are:

- following school rules
- engaging in learning
- following instructions and reasonable requests

All pupils start the week with their name on Green. If children make green choices, they will stay on green. Pupils are reminded of how they can make green choices and are praised for doing so.



Consequences

If pupils do not make green choices, they will be reminded how to stay on or get back to green.

If the behaviour continues, the pupil's name will move towards Red on the chart.

As soon as the behaviour changes positively, their name will move back towards green.

Blue - This is the first warning to change their behaviour.

Yellow - This is the second chance for the pupil to correct their behaviour.

Red - The child will have some reflection time at the Regulation Station in their classroom and have a restorative conversation.

2nd Red in a day - Reflection time and conversation in a buddy classroom. Parents will be contacted.

3rd Red in a day - Reflection time and conversation with SLT.

Rewards

Whole class

Children will be rewarded with green points for making green choices. This will go towards a class reward.

Individual

Children will be moved up the chart towards gold if they consistently make green choices.

They will be given a bronze, silver and gold sticker.

If a child has reached gold within a week, they will receive a gold leaf in Friday's Celebration Assembly to place on our Gold Leaf Tree in the main hall. Their name will then be moved back to green.
