



Co-Headteachers' Message

Welcome back to the Summer term. It has been wonderful to see the children return with such enthusiasm, making a fantastic start to their new topics. We know how much you value insight into your child's education, so please look out for the curriculum webs and supporting documents which will be shared next week. These will provide a detailed overview of the rich and engaging learning experiences planned for the half term.

Our Year 6 cohort is currently working hard as they prepare for their end of Key Stage 2 statutory assessments. These national tests, commonly known as SATs, will take place this May. To ensure every child feels prepared and self-assured, they have been participating in practise assessments this week. We have been immensely impressed by the maturity and focus they have shown; it is a source of great pride for the staff to see them demonstrating such independence and taking genuine ownership of their personal progress.

As we move through the term, our thoughts also turn toward the transition into the next academic year. While many of the formal activities for the children happen later in the term, significant work is already taking place behind the scenes to prepare for next year. This week was particularly special as many families received the news that they have secured a place in our Reception intake for September. We are already busy organising their settling-in sessions and are eager to officially welcome these new families into our school community.

The school has been buzzing with excitement following the arrival of four ducklings, who hatched on Wednesday lunchtime in our Reception classroom. These new arrivals have quickly become the stars of the school, and the Reception children are doing a marvellous job of caring for them. It is remarkable to see how much they have grown in just a few short days. The ducklings will be staying with us until next Friday, providing a wonderful hands-on boost to the "Habitat Hunters" topic in Reception this half term.

Finally, we are pleased to welcome some new faces to our staff team. Mrs. Baxter has joined us as a Teaching Assistant in 1B, and Mrs. Van Sickle will be supporting our children across Reception. We are delighted to announce that Ms. Egleton's baby boy, Bear, arrived early on Wednesday morning. We are certain you will all join us in sending our warmest congratulations and best wishes to her and her family during this special time.

Inclusion Insights

We are working on embedding our Six Principles of Nurture into everything we do. Each week, we will look at how each one is lived at Echelford and how you can support at home.



Safety - Creating an environment that is physically and emotionally secure, structured, and nurturing.

At school, we live this principle through:

- **Consistent Routines:** We use visual timetables so children always know what is coming next.
- **Regulation Stations:** Every classroom has a regulation station where children can go if they feel overwhelmed or they are not in their green zone, helping them learn to manage their emotions safely.
- **Reliable Adults:** Our staff work on developing positive relationships with the children and are reliable and consistent in their approach.
- **Clear expectations:** All our children know what to expect if their choices mean they do not 'stay on green'.

At home, you could try:

- **Predictable routines** - Try to keep mealtimes and bedtimes consistent. If the schedule has to change, give them a "five-minute warning" to help them transition.
- **Validating feelings** - When a child is upset, saying "I can see you're feeling frustrated, and I'm here with you" provides more safety than "stop crying."
- **Calm spaces** - Does your child have a particular space at home where they can go if they are having "big feelings" or are in their red zone?

Our next **SEND parent/carer forum** will be on **Wednesday 29th April from 2-3pm**.

For this session, we will have a guest speaker, Tracy Playfoot, Neurodiversity Advisor from Surrey's Team Around the School Support Hub.

We will talk about the **SEND support process** and the **EHCP process** from both a school and Local Authority point of view, so please come along if you would like to find out more about this.

Changes to school uniform from September 2026

From September 2026 a new limit on the number of compulsory branded items of school uniforms for all pupils will begin. Only 3 branded items; sweatshirt/cardigan, tie and PE t-shirt will be compulsory. Changes to timing of school day from September 2026

A reminder that our school day will be changing slightly next academic year in order to accommodate the two week half term in October. From September, the children will need to ensure that they are in school by 8.45am which is 5 minutes earlier than our current start time.

Now that the mornings are lighter and hopefully brighter, it's a good opportunity to practise getting in slightly earlier so this can become part of your routine before the change in September.

Sports Day

A reminder that our Sports day will be taking place on Wednesday 3rd June and parents and carers are invited to spectate and support. Reception, Year 1 and 2 will be 9.30am-11am and Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be 1.30pm-3pm. Further details will be shared nearer the time but we wanted to ensure that you all have the date and times in your diary so you don't miss out.

Message from Surrey Education Services re antibiotics and ear infections

Survey reveals 1 in 3 parents believe children always need antibiotics for ear infections

36% of parents surveyed believe that children always need antibiotics for ear infection according to research conducted by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA). The study, led by the UKHSA surveyed over 500 parents whose children had experience ear infection symptoms in the previous year.

Ear infections are very common, particularly in children, and often get better on their own within 3 days although sometimes symptoms can last up to a week. Research shows that as few as 1 in 5 children are likely to require antibiotics to treat an ear infection. The NHS have also published advice on what to do if you think your child has ear infection - [Ear infections - NHS](#)

Catherine Hayes, the UKHSA study lead said "While antibiotics are sometimes necessary for children with ear infections, unnecessary antibiotic use can cause side effects in children and contribute to antimicrobial resistance. If your child is prescribed antibiotics, it's important to follow the advice of your GP, nurse or pharmacist." The survey highlights that more can be done to support parents to understand when an ear infection is serious and what they can do. UKHSA's work will aim to address this by developing resources to support health professionals and patients during consultations.

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) occurs when bacteria, viruses, fungi, and parasites evolve to withstand the medicines designed to kill them. This makes standard treatments ineffective, leading to persistent infections, severe illness, or death. It is a natural evolutionary process accelerated by the misuse and overuse of antibiotics

Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will not receive a third penalty notice, however, where there is a third occurrence within the 3 year period, Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.
