St Bride's is one of many churches that were gutted by the fire. Wren's rebuild is the one with the famous wedding-cake steeple. But head down into its excellent crypt museum and you'll find a handful of fragments from the burned church, including pieces of wood, warped window glass and melted bell metal.

Use a glass jar, a silhouette of the buildings, tissue paper and LED candle to recreate London on fire!

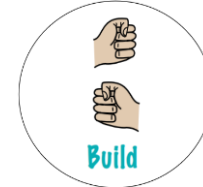
