Places to visit:

Box Hill (National Trust): About 30 minutes from Ashford. It's the perfect place to discuss "contours" and elevation. You can hike to the top to see the panoramic views, talk about the "Chalk" rock that forms the hills, and explore the Stepping Stones at the bottom to see how water shapes the landscape.

The Devil's Punch Bowl (Hindhead): A bit further south down the A3. This is a massive natural amphitheatre. It's great for talking about erosion and how "mountains" or large hills are shaped over millions of years.

Surrey Summit / Yellow Spider Climbing: If you want a literal "climbing a mountain" experience, there are great indoor climbing centres in Guildford (Surrey Sports Park) or Carshalton. It's a fun way to feel the force of gravity while pretending to scale Everest!
