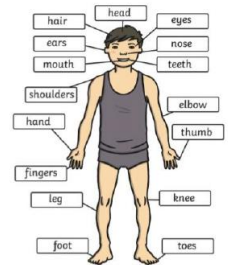

DT knowledge:

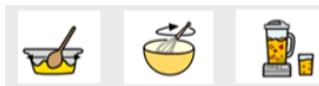
Fruits come from the flowering part of a plant and contain seeds.

Some fruit is grown here in the UK and you can even find some growing wild. Fruit needs a lot of sun to grow and ripen so lots of the fruit you eat is grown in warmer countries. Some foods that we call vegetables are actually fruits.

The fruit of a plant is the part that contains the seeds. So foods like tomatoes, cucumbers and peppers are fruits not vegetables because they contain seeds. You should eat a minimum of five portions of fruit and vegetables every day. Oats are carbohydrates and they give you energy over a long period of time. Milk is dairy and this is a good source of calcium.
