Music

The 4/4 time signature means that there are 4 crotchet beats in each bar.



Some different ways pitch can move: scale, step, arpeggio, chord moving in thirds.

scale = a sequence of notes that move in step, up and down.

moving in step = notes moving up or down one note at a time.

arpeggio = the notes of a chord played one at a time in sequence

chords moving in thirds = two notes from a chord, three notes apart, moving up in step

Hand-to-hand sticking = play tuned percussion alternating hands.
