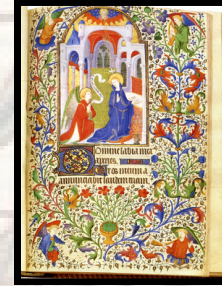
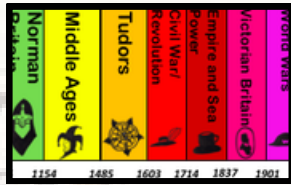




# Medieval Britain



## History

- The Medieval period is the time between 1066 and 1485. The Medieval period is often called the middle or dark ages.
- During the Middle Ages, kings were considered to be the top of the social hierarchy with all the control and the peasants at the bottom.
- John became King in 1199 after his brother Richard the Lionheart died without any children.
- King John became unpopular during his reign. The Barons grew tired of the King's demands and formed a rebellion against the monarchy.
- In 1215, King John was forced to sign the Magna Carta which ensured certain rights for the people. By signing the document, King John agreed to do his duty as King of England, upholding the law and running a fair government.
- The Magna Carta introduced the notion of democracy.
- Magna Carta was issued in June 1215 and was the first document to put into writing the principle that the king and his government was not above the law. It sought to prevent the king from exploiting his power, and placed limits of royal authority by establishing law as a power in itself.
- The Magna Carta was signed at Runnymede, Windsor - a local area.
- Castles were crucial in medieval times as military fortresses, symbols of power, and centers of administration and government. They served as residences for royalty and nobility, offering protection from invasions and rebellions

## Art

### Illuminated Manuscripts

- The word "manuscript" from the Latin words manus (hand) and scriptus (writing) means "written by hand."
- The word "illuminated," from the Latin illuminare, means "lighted up." For a book to truly be illuminated, it had to be decorated with gold.
- Medieval manuscript decoration included small painted scenes (called miniatures), intricate borders, ornate letters, and even elaborate full-page paintings.

### Printing

- Poly block is a polystyrene based printing material which you can work into using a biro or a pencil
- Relief printing- when you carve into a printing block that you then use to press onto paper and make a print.

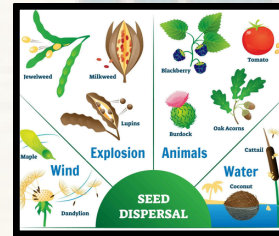

## Science

- All plants need: air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow. This may differ from plant to plant.
- Pollen is a fine powder that plants produce.
- Pollination is the transference of pollen from one plant to another.
- A new seed is formed once a plant has been pollinated.
- Seed dispersal is the movement of seeds away from the parent plant.
- Seeds can be dispersed in different ways.
- Leaves collect energy from the sun to make food.
- Roots collect water and nutrients and help the stability of the plant.
- Stems hold the plant up and bring the water and nutrients to the different parts of the plant.
- Flowers attract pollinators and produce the seeds.
- A pollinator is an animal that moves pollen.
- Through their roots, plants absorb the water from the soil, which then travels up the plant through its water transport system.

## Computing

- Software is the programs, or instructions, that tell the hardware what to do.
