NAS Surrey Branch Climbing Taster Sessions in Walton

We are once again organising two one-hour taster sessions for children with ASDs and their siblings aged 6 – 17 at High Sports indoor climbing wall at the Xcel Leisure Centre, Walton. The sessions are designed to give children a chance to learn a new skill and socialise with others (whilst doing something else). There are two, one-hour sessions for up to 10 children with ASDs:

Time: 2.00 – 3.00pm OR 3.00 – 4.00pm

Date: Sunday 25th February

Location: High Sports indoor climbing wall, Xcel Leisure Centre, Walton-on-Thames

Cost: Suggested donation £7.50 per child (subsidised)

We have support from two High Sports staff who will explain about ropes and climbing. PLEASE NOTE, PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR CHILDREN THROUGHOUT. We have reserved a dedicated area of the climbing walls, but other areas will be open to the public, so people will be coming and going throughout our sessions. The climbing area is adjacent to the main reception area in the leisure centre so can be very noisy and is only enclosed by a low wall, so is not fully secure. If your child has been to one of our events before, you may like to know that the facility has been extensively refurbished and re-branded 'Rockbox' so will look very different to previous years.

YMCA East Surrey in Reigate – YMCA will be delivering Yippee & Yip4Youth ASD days during February, May and October half terms, as well as in the summer holidays. Sessions will be delivered across East Surrey, including at a purpose built centre for children and young people with disabilities in Reigate. All staff are trained in meeting the needs of children with disabilities and have special training in behaviour management and communication methods, such as Makaton. A high staff to child ratio ensures that each child receives the support they need and, with the help of young volunteers, they create a lively and fun atmosphere. 40% of spaces are for children and young people who require 1-2-1 support.

January Behaviour Workshop – Further Resources

We had a very informative workshop on managing behaviour by independent autism specialist and teacher, Sue Goldman. She provided a wealth of tips and advice about understanding behaviour, which she explained is effectively a form of communication – particularly in children and young people who struggle with verbal or interactive communication.

She gave a helpful action plan for parents to complete after an incident involving upsetting behaviour: 1) look at the reasons – sensory, communication, anxiety. 2) think of proactive strategies for future events when your child is in the ‘green zone’ – i.e. not upset and ‘orange zone’ – potentially heading towards a problem. Then think of any proactive strategies you could use when they are in the ‘red zone’, perhaps in a full meltdown for example. Sue stressed the importance of allowing a child (and parent/carer) time for recovery after a meltdown or outburst.

Blue Badge Eligibility Consultation – Closes 18th March

There is a new government consultation on the blue badge parking scheme. This consultation is looking at a range of views on making a change to the eligibility to take into account people with non-physical conditions which affect a person's ability to get from place to place. This would include people with autism.

PIP Mobility award

Recent changes to the rules for getting Personal Independence Payment (PIP) for mobility have been successfully challenged in court. The change which came in last year meant that to qualify for the PIP Mobility component, claimants had to show that they couldn't travel without another person or assistance. Previously, one of the grounds for qualifying was that travelling caused psychological distress. The court ruled that the new rule was discrimination, so the rule change no longer applies and claimants may now qualify for the mobility payment if they can show that travelling causes them psychological distress. This may apply to some people with autism.
