Re-write one of your favourite stories you have read.


Write a diary entry to help you remember all the fun things you have been up to at home.

After baking or cooking, write instructions explaining what you had to do.


Label and describe a model you have made.

You need a **CAPITAL LETTER** at the start of your sentence.



You need a **full stop** at the end of your sentence.




You need **finger spaces** in between your words.



You need to **check** your sentence to see if it **sounds right**.

Reception teachers say it is important we try to form all of our letters correctly. Below is an example of how we should be forming each letter in the alphabet. A great (and fun) way to practise your handwriting is by drawing letters in the sand, using chalk on the ground or making them using playdough!



Reception teachers say you should sound out your words as you are writing. If you are unsure of a sound use the sound mats below!
